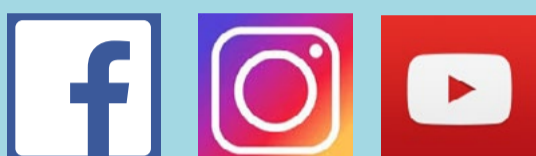

The Great Lakes Stewardship Initiative received \$244,000 from the highly competitive MiSTEM Advisory Council Awards, one of only 21 projects funded.
