## SUMMER 2018 EXPERIENCES



### JULY: Lake Huron Place-Based Stewardship Education Summer Institute

NEMIGLSI educators and partners ventured out into the field to learn more about fish habitat, life cycles and morphology. Visiting a variety of locations like Harrisville State Park, Cedar Brook Trout Farm and Lost Lake Woods Club allowed teachers to identify very different types of fish habitat and scout locations for future PBSE projects. Each teacher formulated a project to implement in their classroom and received a \$500 project stipend made possible through a partnership with the Sea Grant Center for Great Lakes Literacy and Great Lakes NOAA BWET. ### AUGUST: 4-H Great Lakes and Natural Resources Camp

Campers got to learn about environmental stewardship of the Great Lakes and Michigan's natural resources this month. Camp Chickagami, which sits between Lake Esau and Lake Huron offers diverse habitat study locations within walking distance. Campers explored wooded areas, a coastal fen and the local lighthouses. They also explored the waters of both Lake Esau and Lake Huron--onshore and below the surface by snorkeling and using ROVs (remotely operated vehicles).
